

# 4.3.3 Programs Open to General Public

The University of the Visayas (UV) actively offers programs and events open to the general public, demonstrating its serious commitment to community engagement, partnerships and lifelong learning. UV provides short-term education courses, seminars, colloquia and workshops for professionals, community leaders, and industry workers seeking research skills, upholding practical skills, and career advancement.

The university also delivers vocational and short-term technical training in fields such as Housekeeping NC II, Housekeeping NC III, Housekeeping NC IV, Bread and Pastry Production NC II, Cookery NC II, Food and Beverage Services NC II, Bookkeeping NC

II, Tourism Services NC II, Tourism Promotion Services NC II, Events Management Services NC II and Shielded Metal Arc Welding NC I and NC II. A total of 858 were assessed in the year 2024 broken down as follows: 337 from Housekeeping NC II, 60 from Break and Pastry Production NC II, 50 from Cookery NC II and 411 from Food and Beverage Services NC II. As a TESDA-accredited training and assessment center, UV conducts competency-based programs and administers official TESDA assessments, enabling participants to earn nationally recognized certifications that support both local and international employment opportunities.

In addition, UV regularly hosts international research conferences that bring together scholars, practitioners, and students from various countries to share studies and engage in global academic dialogue. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> Regional Research Conference in 2024, a total of 69 research enthusiasts attended, composing of faculty members and graduate students. Joining a regional research conference has a significant impact on participants' academic and professional growth and it provides a platform to share research findings, receive constructive feedback, and refine scholarly work. Through engagement with researchers from neighboring institutions and regions, participants gain new perspectives, strengthen their understanding of emerging trends, and discover opportunities for collaboration. By opening these programs, assessments, and conferences to the wider public, the University of the Visayas strengthens its mission of inclusive education, skills development, and global knowledge exchange.

Through these efforts, UV continues to open its doors to the community, ensuring that learning and growth remain within everyone's reach and these programs underscore UV's dedication to fostering lifelong learning and meaningful societal impact.






