

#### Serving with a H.E.A.R.T.: The UV Community Extension Program

Guided by its vision of becoming an internationally recognized private, non-sectarian university committed to academic excellence and transformational, innovative education, the University of the Visayas (UV) continues to translate its aspirations into concrete community impact through its dynamic extension programs. In 2024, UV's community extension initiatives reached a total of **2,320 beneficiaries**, made possible by the dedicated service of **1,502 faculty members**, **students**, **and staff volunteers**. These figures highlight not only the scale of UV's social engagement but also its strong culture of volunteerism, service-learning, and institutional responsibility.

UV's extension work directly advances its mission to capacitate communities guided by the university extension program and to serve as a catalyst for social transformation. Health missions, wellness campaigns, medical and dental services, and psychosocial support activities significantly contributed to SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-Being) by improving access to preventive healthcare and promoting community resilience. These initiatives also provided rich service-learning platforms that strengthened student competencies and faculty engagement, reinforcing UV's commitment to transformational education.

In support of its mission to **develop the talents and potential of students toward professional practice responsive to local and global industry needs**, UV's extension activities promoted lifelong learning and inclusive education under **SDG 4 (Quality Education)**. Literacy programs, tutorials, skills training, coastal clean-ups, and student volunteer engagements extended learning beyond the classroom into real-world community contexts. These activities helped bridge educational gaps among underserved learners while simultaneously shaping students into socially responsible and industry-responsive professionals.

By intentionally prioritizing marginalized and underserved populations—especially low-income families, geographically isolated communities, and crisis-affected groups—UV advances **SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities)**. Its extension programs reduce social, economic, and spatial disparities by improving access to education, health services, livelihood skills, and community empowerment opportunities. The high volume of beneficiaries reached in 2024 demonstrates UV's effectiveness in translating its mission of **social transformation** into measurable and inclusive impact.

Central to the success of these initiatives is UV's strong commitment to **partnerships and collaboration**, in direct support of **SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals)**. Through sustained engagement with barangays, local government units, non-government organizations, schools, faith-based institutions, and international partners, UV strengthened collective action and shared responsibility for development outcomes. The mobilization of **1,502 volunteers** reflects the effectiveness of these partnerships in scaling interventions, optimizing resources, and sustaining community programs.

Overall, UV's combined reach of **2,320 beneficiaries and 1,502 volunteers** powerfully reflects its mission to **build a community of God-centered, nationalistic, and globally competitive professionals with proactive values and attitudes**. More than a set of outreach activities, UV's community extension is a living expression of its institutional identity—where academic excellence, professional formation, community capacitation, and global responsibility converge. With continued strengthening of impact monitoring, SDG alignment, and strategic partnerships, the University of the Visayas is well positioned to further affirm its role as a **regional and global catalyst for sustainable and inclusive development**.

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#### 1.0 OBJECTIVES

- 1.1 To initiate the conduct of extension services and outreach activities based on the student's field of specialization in collaboration of the project partners from the industry, NGO's, GO's and Private Organizations.
- 1.2 To establish the protocols on the conduct of community services.

#### 2.0 SCOPE

This applies to all academic and academic support units across all campuses of the University of the Visayas (Senior High School, Tertiary Level and Graduate Studies) in the conduct of the community extension services and outreach activities.

#### 3.0 POLICIES

- 3.1 The conduct of the extension services and outreach activities shall be in consonance with the University's vision, mission, core values, and community extension program framework.
- 3.2 The development and implementation of the extension program shall follow three major phases of activities:
  - 3.2.1 Phase 1:Linkage Development and Planning
    - 3.2.1.1 The Annual COMEX Calendar shall be submitted to the CES Office a month prior to the start of the Academic Year.
    - 3.2.1.2 The need assessment result should be completed 3 months prior to the start of the Academic Year .
  - 3.2.2 All MOA and MOU should pass through the legal team of the University with the recommendations from the COMEX Office through electronic mails.
  - 3.2.3 Phase 2: Community Outreach
    - 3.2.3.1 All units should inform the COMEX Office at least a week prior to the implementation of the activity by submitting the PMF Confirmation form.
    - 3.2.3.2 Parents/Guardian's approval is a requirement to students below 18 years of age in order to participate in the conduct of community extension services.
    - 3.2.3.3 MOA/MOU with three years and beyond validity should provide a progress report every 6 months.
    - 3.2.3.4 Implement the approved Community Extension Program.

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- 3.2.4 Phase 3 Outcome Assessment
  - 3.2.4.1 Conduct Post Intervention
  - 3.2.4.2 Conduct Outcomes Survey
- 3.3 The emphasis on environment conservation and action should be integrated on the conduct of services and outreach activities.
- 3.4 The implementation of the extension services and outreach activities should be included in the operational plan and continuity plan by all units.
- 3.5 The extension services and outreach activities must not affect the scheduled classes and the planned activity must be filed seven working days ahead of the actual day of services.
- 3.6 All projects shall be reviewed and approved by the President and Chief Executive Officer prior to implementation.
- 3.7 Every volunteer, including COMEX representatives, faculty members, staff, students, barangay authorities of the neighborhood, alumni, and project partners, is welcome to participate in all services and activities.
- 3.8 The organizer shall monitor and submit a copy of all activity forms and documentation to the COMEX Office.
- 3.9 The research outputs on community extension and outreach activities are expected to be submitted on the first day of the last month of the academic year.






